****Student Paper Competition****

Complete Manuscripts Due: May 9th 2011

Again, this year we will sponsor a student paper competition in an effort to encourage and foster the participation of **undergraduate and graduate students** in the research areas related to unmanned untethered submersible technology. The student paper competition is a special activity of UUST and the date for submission of the completed student papers is **May 9th, 2011**. The competition is open to all students enrolled in a degree program on a full or part time basis at an accredited college or university in a technical or scientific curriculum. All authors involved in the development of the paper must be students at the time the paper is submitted. When submitting papers to this competition, authors must specify which technical area listed most closely relates to the primary content of the paper. Each winner (primary author only) will receive a **\$1,000.00 scholarship** and an invitation to present their winning paper at the Symposium. All of the author's expenses at the Symposium will be paid including: travel, lodging, meals and registration. A winner must be present at the Symposium to receive their award. Papers will be judged on technical content and originality. **** Note: Although submission of an abstract is not required, please email us and let us know of your intent to submit a paper by May 2nd, 2011 and please include the title of the paper in your message.** This will allow us to assemble an appropriate group of reviewers. ****** Winners will be notified on June 27th, 2011.
